


Frederick Hodges (1896 – 1968)

It came as quite a shock to find that my Great Great Great Grandfather on my mother's side had been a Convict in Australia in the 19th century. Although when I looked further into his background I was astonished when I found the Documents relating to the Court Case that he had received a 7 year sentence for just stealing a Goose from a local farm. His accomplice in the act was his friend Joseph Atkins, who received 14 years Transportation. He later appealed against it in January the following year, but without success and after confinement on a Prison Hulk at Chatham was taken with 270 other convicts to New South Wales in Australia to complete his sentence. He was finally released on the 1st December 1843. He never returned to his family in Worcester in England. The 1841 Census shows his wife, who no doubt washed her hands of him, described as a "Widow" bringing up their four children. It is Thomas the youngest, who was born on the 1st January, 1837, whilst his father was on his way to serve his prison sentence in Australia, whom I am descended from. He was the youngest of four children born to Thomas and Sarah before his departure from these shores.

Thomas Hodges senior was born in 1803 in the village of Hallow, near Worcester. Unfortunately, I have not at the moment been able to go back any further with both him and his family, apart from a brother – William who was born in 1806 and whose family lived in the same village. Thomas married Sarah Huntley in 1825, whom I know more about thanks to the 1841 Census, which shows her living in Crows Nest Lane, Lower Broadheath, near Worcester. This did not mean much to me until I found that it was also the birthplace of the great English Composer, Sir Edward Elgar in 1857. It seems that in the 1850s the name was changed to the more important sounding - Crown East Lane, which still exists. She may well have known him as he would have been a close neighbour and whose house is now owned by the National Trust and opened to the public. The 1840 Tithe Map for Broadheath clearly shows her renting a cottage (no. 142) from George Vernon who also owned the neighbouring cottage which was rented by Henry Bond, who appears just below her on the Census list. She was to live here and bring up her family on her own until her death in 1871, aged 65. It is his son Thomas, who married Sarah in 1863 and they go in to have six children. Their daughter, Sarah who is to be the mother of my Grandfather, Frederick who is born to her in 1896 and bought up by her parents. Fortunately, their neighbour's son John Wanklyn is to marry her in 1904 and adopt Frederick. They go on to have their own child, Elsie, who is born in 1906. The two children are close to one another and there is a record of her staying with her step brothers family in 1964 at 49 Trelawn Road in Brixton. Four years later she marries Ernest Eastwood and died in 1999, aged 93.


ATKINS, Joseph, aged 42, labourer, and **HODGES, Thomas**, aged 31, cordwainer, were next arraigned and found guilty on the clearest evidence of stealing, on the 8th of September last, at Wichenford, a **goose**, the property of Richard Browning, farmer, (the particulars of which we gave in our Petty Sessions report at the time of their commitment). Atkins is well known in this city and neighbourhood, and almost every town in the county, each of which he has been in the habit of alternately visiting in the exercise of his avocation as a notorious common informer. He made no defence nor called any witness to character; but on his fellow prisoner (**Hodges**) calling **Thomas Colley** to give him a character, he (Atkins) asked him if he had not once during his constableness a warrant to search the house, upon a suspicion of felony, of Sarah Maria Walker, the principal witness against him, who swore that she saw Atkins catch the **goose** and cut its head off. Colley replied that he remembered having a search warrant under the circumstances named by the prisoner Atkins, but it was not against any person of the name of Walker. Atkins replied that it was the same person, but that she had since changed her name by marriage, and that her evidence ought not to be relied on as the principal witness against him; and complained that his Counsel had been guilty of a great omission by not impressing this circumstance upon the minds of the Jury. A certificate was put in and proved by Tilt, one of the beadles, that Atkins had been convicted at the City Sessions, on the 2nd of July, 1832, of stealing a piece of beef from the shop of Mr. Payne, butcher, Bridge-street, and adjudged to 12 months' imprisonment for that offence. The Chairman, after making some suitable remarks on Atkins's former conviction, sentenced him to **fourteen and Hodges to seven years' transportation.**







1841 Census

The 1840 Tithe Map clearly shows Thomas Hodge's wife, Sarah renting a cottage from George Vernon on Crows Nest Lane (later changed to Crown East Lane) in the village of Lower Broadheath. Her neighbour, Henry Bond, who appears next on the list of occupiers on the 1841 Census, also rents from Vernon. She is described as a Seamstress, aged 42 with her four children - Ann, Joseph, Richard and Thomas.

The House almost opposite is famous today as the Birthplace of Edward Elgar in 1857





In 1891 Thomas Hodges, aged 54, a Gardener is living with his wife, Sarah aged 52 – a Laundress. Their children – William, aged 18 and Selina aged 13 occupy their house on the Northwick Road, Claines, Worcester.

Frederick Hodges (1896 – 1968)

Frederick Hodges was born to Sarah Hodges on the 7th October, 1898. His father is not known, although his mother, Sarah, was to later marry John Wanklyn, the son of her neighbour when they lived at 60 Northwick Road in Worcester. Sarah would have been an unmarried mother, aged 23. John Wanklyn would not have been the father as he was serving in Worcester Regiment in Bermuda from October 1897 until December 1899. He had joined the Army in 1892 and saw action in East India, Malta, Bermuda and finally South Africa in the Boer War. The 1901 Census shows Fredrick, aged 2 living with his grandparents, Thomas and Sarah, at 4 Union Place in Worcester. His mother's occupation is that of a Laundress.

The next Census in 1911 gives us further information regarding Frederick who is now living with his mother and new stepfather, John Wanklyn. His mother is shown to have married John in 1904. He now has a stepsister as the couple have a daughter, Elsie Wanklyn in 1906. They are all living with the grandmother, Sarah Hodges who is now a widow at 11 Saunders Street in Worcester. This is to be the family home for many years afterwards. At that time it was on the outskirts of the city overlooking countryside, although now the area has had considerable housing built on it. Frederick's father was a Leather Worker and his mother a Laundress.

In 1914 Frederick was one of the first recruits in what was to become the First World War, when he enrolls in September of that year, aged just 16. His Enlistment form with many others has survived, although rather tattered. It shows that he had previously followed his father's occupation as a Leather Cutter living at 11 Saunders Street in the City of Worcester. The enrolment form shows him as 830612 Gunner 2512 in the South Midland Territorial Army Brigade. He was based at Ingatestone in Essex in May 1915 where he remained in the area on defensive duties and training. He was posted with the 307th Brigade RFA on the 29th August 1916. The Regiment took part in the Battle of the Somme in 1916, the Battle of Pozieres and the Third Battle of Ypres.

Unfortunately Frederick becomes one of the many casualties of the war when on September 19th 1917 he almost died from Mustard Gas and Shell Shock on the Western Front. He spends time in a French Hospital with Rheumatic Fever in his joints and then returns to England to the Command Depot at Ripon.

In July 1918 he goes to India where he is posted to the 1107th Howitzer Battery RFA stationed at Hyderabad. They were based at Quetta between June and December during a period of civil disturbances and were in action against Afghan rebels on the Indian frontier. His time in action was cut short when he was admitted to Hyderabad Sind Hospital on 9 September 1918 with Malaria and Rheumatic Fever where he remained until November. He then returned to England and Records show him in Hospital in Endell Street in London before being moved to The Convalescent Hospital at Eastbourne. Here he recovered and finally left on the 26th July 1919 and returned home to his family at 11 Saunders Street in Worcester. He is shown to have joined the Territorial Army on the 31st March 1920. At the same time he had applied for a post in the City Police in London. A letter from him to his Officers asking for a reference to join the Police Force dated 6th October 1920 has survived. It was no doubt successful as he was to become a Policeman and spend the rest of his working life in London.

In 1923 he married Edith Pratt who is a housemaid at the Reuben Hotel opposite Buckingham Palace. They move to Police accommodation in Thrush Street, Walworth in London. It is here that their son is born the following year and named Frederick after his father. They are to have a daughter in 1929, when Edith (my Mother) is born at that address. When she is three years of age, the family move to new built flats in Brixton, South London called Ferndale Court. Norman Hodges is born there in 1932 and Gerald Hodges in 1939. The 1939 Census describes Frederick as a police constable living at 135 Ferndale Court in Brixton. Both his wife and children were as with many others in London spend time in the Countryside as evacuees.

After the war the family move to their own house at 45 Trelawn Road in Brixton. It is here that in 1948 that their daughter is living before getting married to my father, Edward Mattingly at St. Matthews Church in Brixton on the 30th July that year.

In 1967 Frederick and Edith move to 29 Cudham Gardens, Cliftonville, Margate to be near their daughter. Sadly he was not able to enjoy it for long before dying in Margate Hospital the following year. Edith was to live a long life before her death in 1994, aged 94.
