


The earliest Census record is that for the 1841 returns for Eling, It shows Henry Mattingly, living at Winsor, as a Groom, aged 25, with Mary his wife, aged 30 with William, aged 6, Thomas, aged 3 and Mary aged 8 months.


The 1851 Census for Calmore in parish of Eling showing Henry Mattingly (aged 38) widow with William (aged 15), Thomas (aged 12), Mary (aged 10), James (aged 6), Richard (aged 3). Henry has moved from nearby Winsor and is shown as an Agricultural Labourer born in Stoneham, Hampshire in the year 1813.

The 1861 Census for Calmore shows Henry Mattingly, aged 48 remarried to Ann Winkworth, aged 59. He is still living at Calmore in probably the same cottage. He share it with his son, John aged 16, and Richard, aged 14.

The 1871 Census shows Henry, now aged 57, living with his wife Ann, much older at 68 at the same cottage at Calmore He is described a formerly being a Groom who is now an Invalid. His brother Charles is living near by at Tatchbury Lodge, with his wife Anne and his sister Jane, who is unmarried.


The 1881 Census shows Henry Mattingly (aged 66) born in 1815 in Stoneham, Hampshire, former Labourer, living at Calmore, Eling in Hampshire. He is still living in Eling with his second wife, Ann, aged 78, who was born in Eling in 1803. It is in this year that he is to die.






1841 Census for Winsor/Tatchbury follows roughly in order compared with the Tithe Map two years later. The list is as follows: James Hurst, Henry Mattingly, Joseph Bevis, Peter Cabbatt, Benjamin Wren, Richard Bessant, Elizabeth Philpott, Fanny Beany, Hammett Taylor, Richard Thomas, Robert Whitmarsh. Benjamin Wren is not in that locality in 1841











The Map shows the proximity of Henry and Charles Mattingly Houses. The 1841 Census shows Henry initially living in Winsor, although later he moved to Calmore, which is nearby.







The 1881 Census shows Henry Mattingly living at Calmore Cottage with his neighbour James Budden. He had occupied this cottage from 1851, when he had moved from nearby Winsor. He lived in half of Calmore Cottage, shown in the accompanying photos in 1928 when it came up for auction and today. The other half was occupied by the Budden family for over 50 years according to the Auction details, when it was sold for £275.






