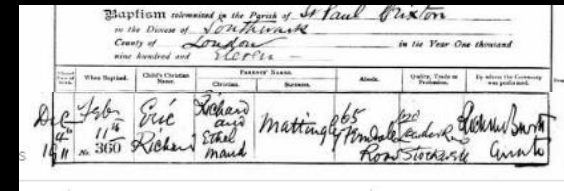
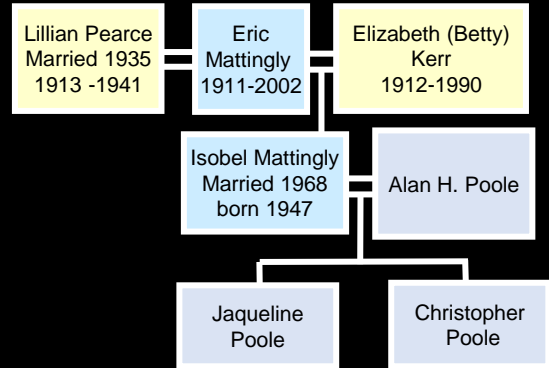


Eric Mattingly (1911 -2002)

Eric was born in 1911 to Richard and Ethel Mattingly who were living at 65 Ferndale Road. There is also reference to the other house, no. 120 Ferndale Road when he is baptised on the 11th February that year at St. Paul's Church, Santley Street in Brixton. He is to later work in a Brewery in London after being recommended by his uncle, Charles Grimble, who worked there. In 1935 he married Lilian Pearce, when he was aged 22 and moved to 12 Dasset Road in Norwood, London. Tragically she was to lose her life in 1941 during a bombing raid. Eric served in the Royal Artillery during the war in the 62nd Anti Tank Regiment. Unfortunately he was seriously wounded during the D Day landings and was sent to recover in Scotland. It was here that he was to meet his future wife, Elizabeth Kerr, whom he married. They were to live at the family home, 19 Concanon Road and look after his father, Richard Mattingly. They had a daughter, Isobel, born in 1947. The family moved from Brixton after the death of his father in 1965 to Gravesend. Eric died there in 2002, aged 91.
