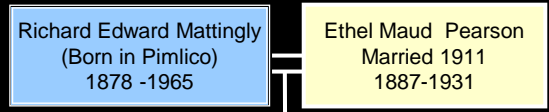

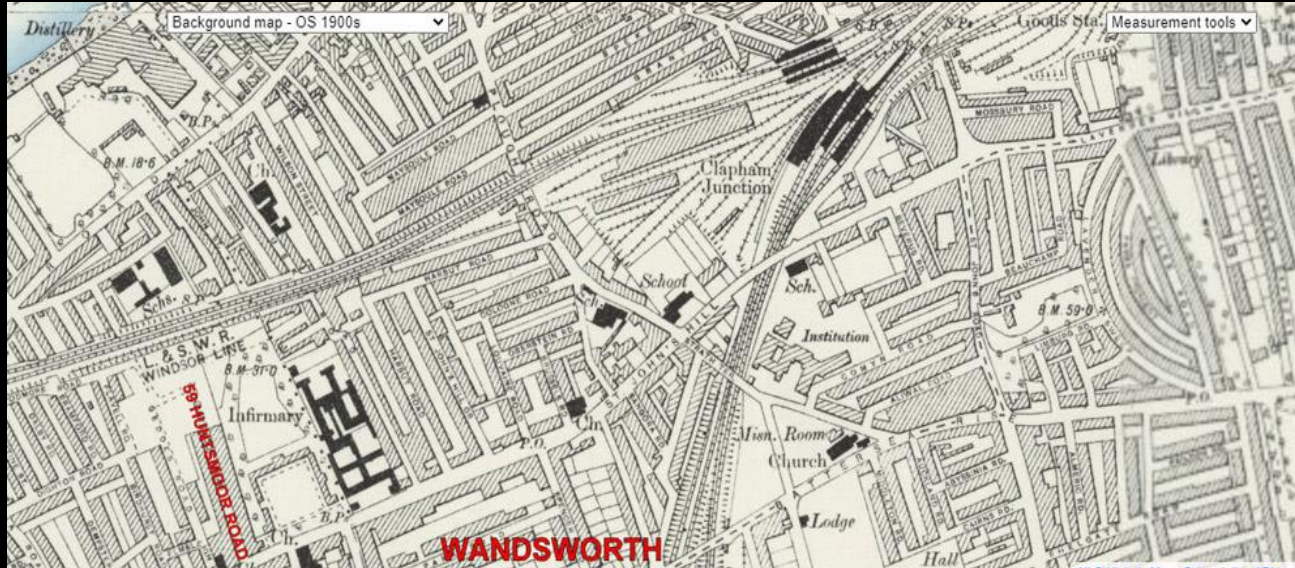

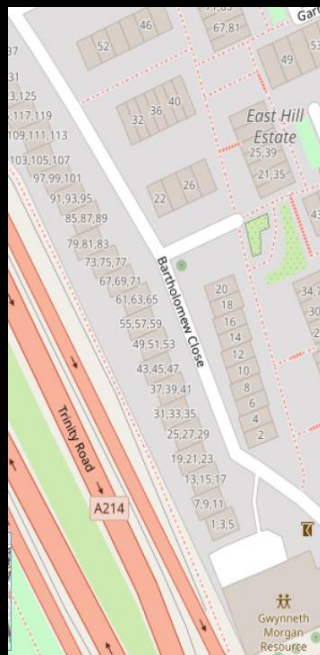

The death of Ethel Maud Mattingly on April 24th 1931, aged 44 years, who was married to Richard Edward Mattingly, a general labourer of 59 Huntsmoor Road, Wandsworth. They were to live there from 1915 until 1932, when Richard moved with his family to 19 Concanon Road in Brixton, where he was to spend the rest of his life until he died in 1965. He initially rented this from his Aunt – Rose Grimble, who was shown living there in 1929 on the Death Certificate for Elizabeth Mattingly, her mother.

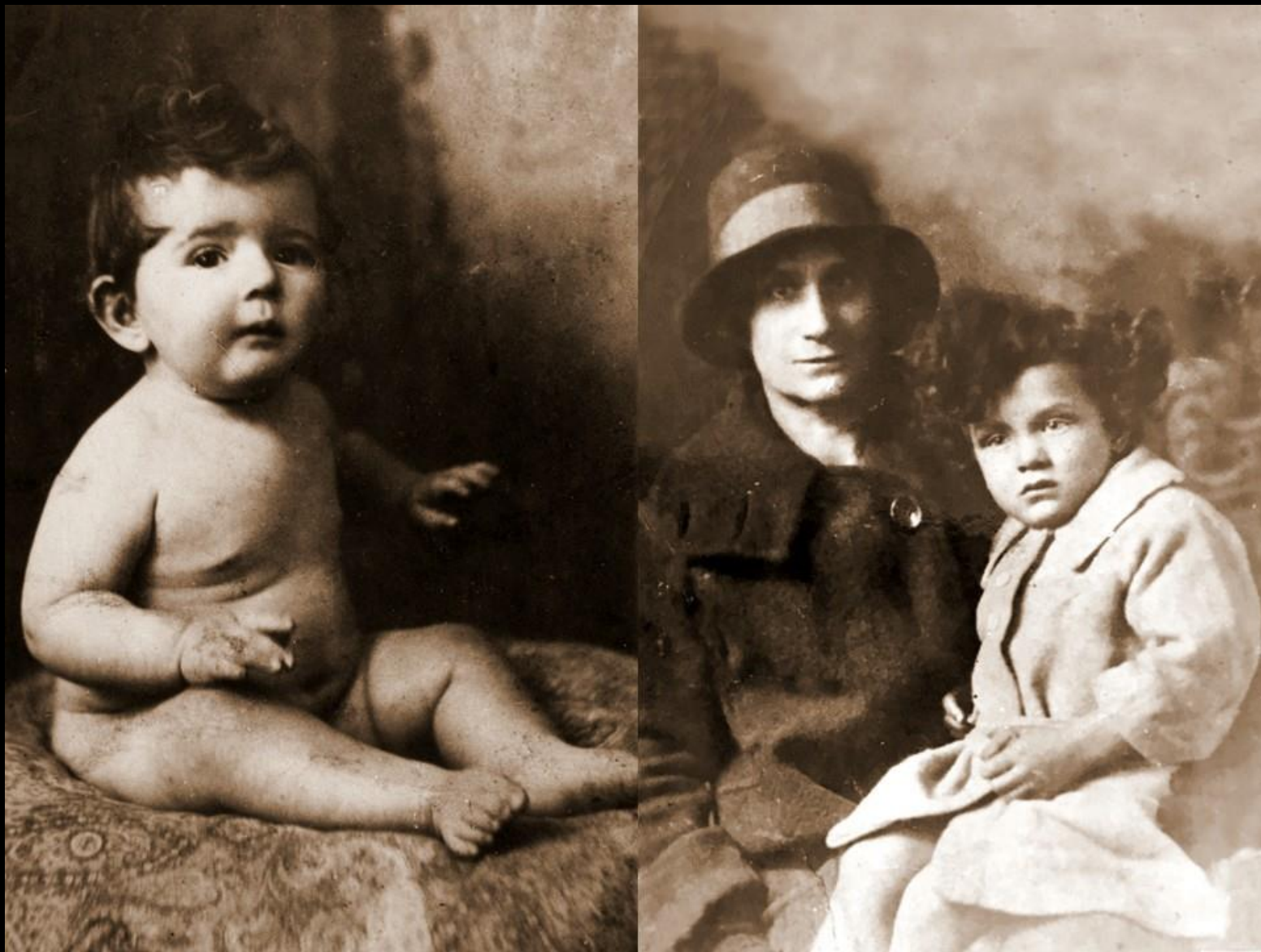

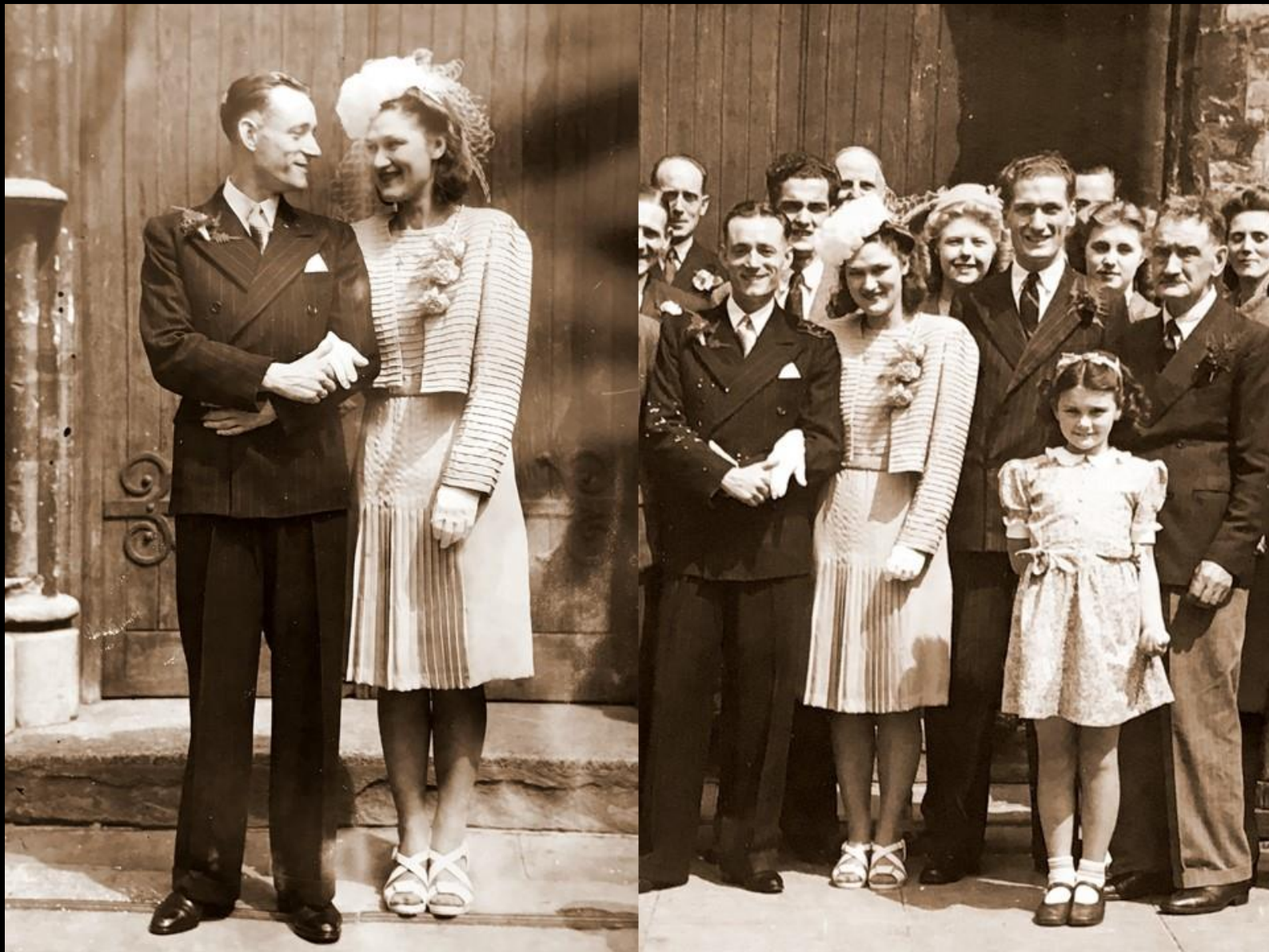
